The testing schedule is as follows:

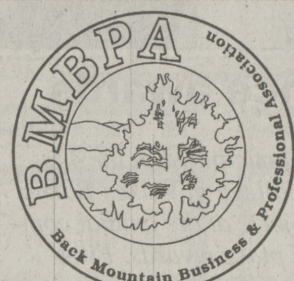
8th grade: April 8 through 12, 15 & 18 - Pennsylvania Assessment Tests (PSSA) in reading and mathematics.

6th grade: April 8 - Test of Cognitive Skills; April 9 through 12 - Terra Nova Achievement Tests in reading and mathematics.

College Misericordia is now offering three new credit-bearing certificate programs in the area of New Media to meet the growing demand for technology education and training for individuals and business.

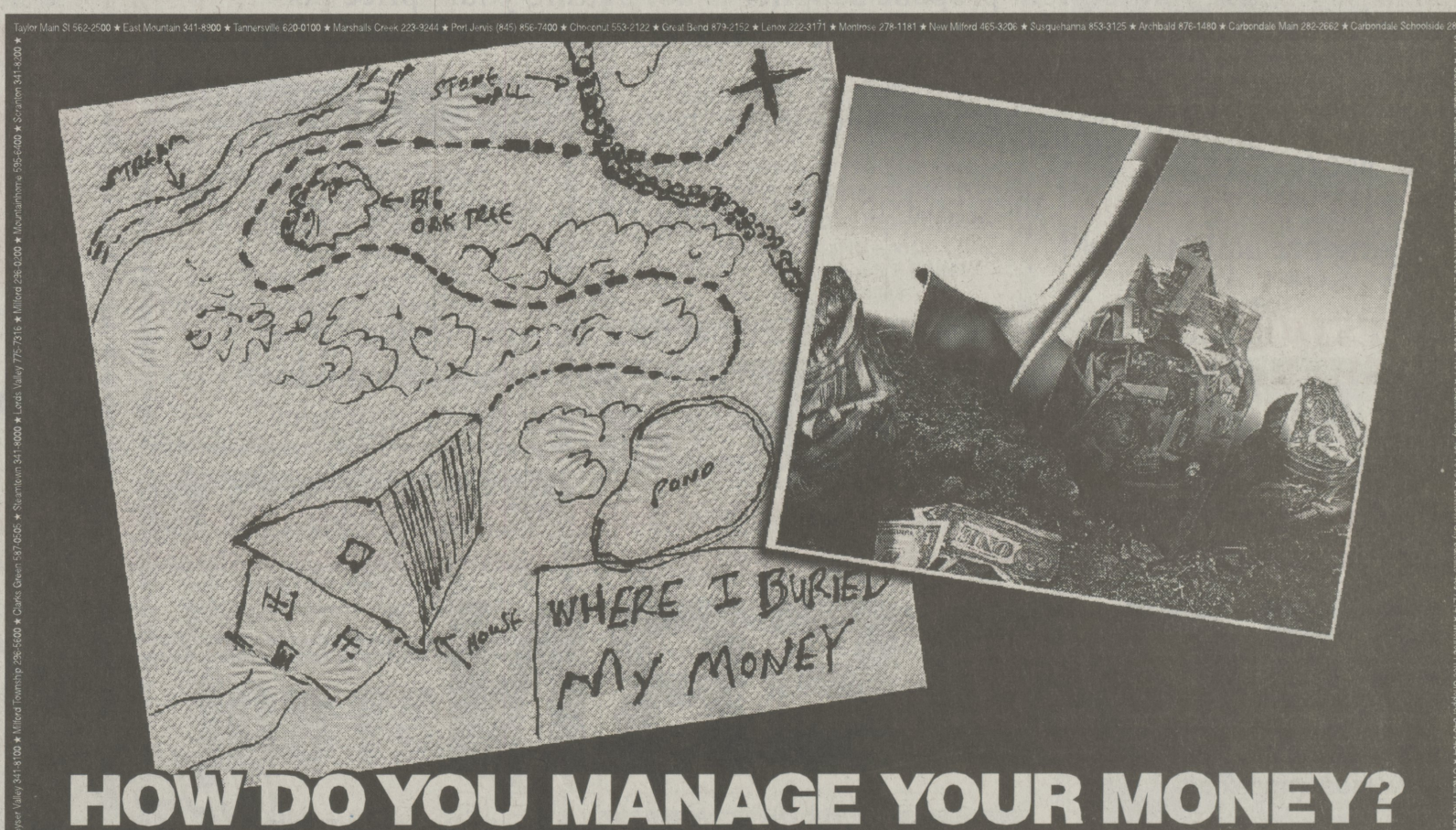
