Dallas man dies, son hurt when car hits pole

DALLAS TWP. — An area psychologist was killed and his son injured when their car crashed into a utility pole on West Overbrook Road on Saturday morn-

James McAndrew, 51, of Woodside Drive in Dallas, died at Community Medical Center in Scranton, said Lackawanna County Coroner Joe Brennan.

McAndrew died of internal injuries more than two hours after the crash, Brennan said.

McAndrew's son, Sean McAndrew, was treated and released at CMC, officials there said.

Dallas Township police said speed might have been a factor in the crash, which occurred just after 11:30 a.m. James McAndrew, who was driving his 1998 Porsche Boxster, was airlifted to CMC from College Misericordia.

Police Chief Robert Jolley said Tuesday an investigation into the cause of the crash was continuing, and included a state police reconstruction of the circumstances.




