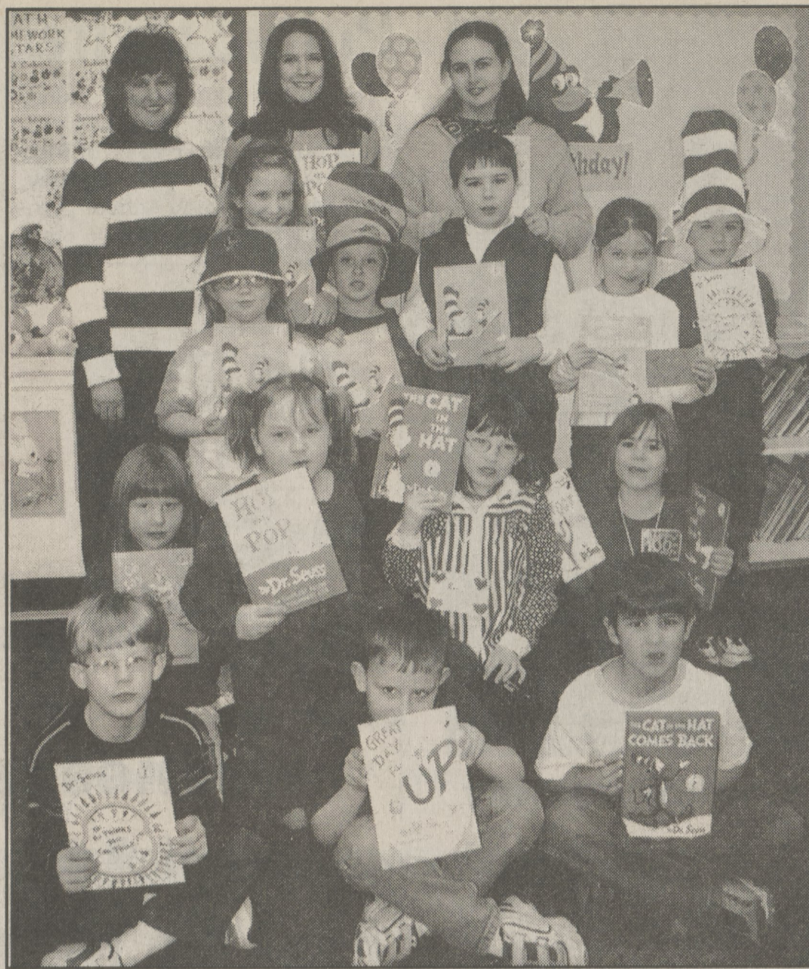

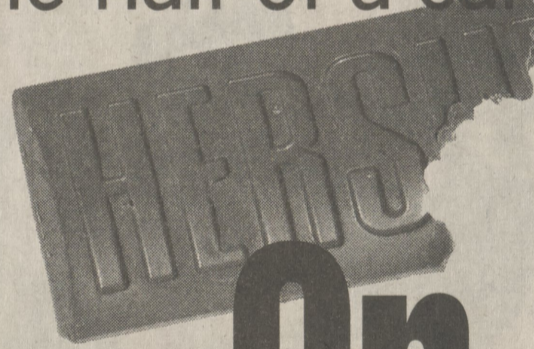

Houssock, a 2000 graduate of Lake-Lehman High school, is the daughter of John and Ann Houssock, Sweet Valley.

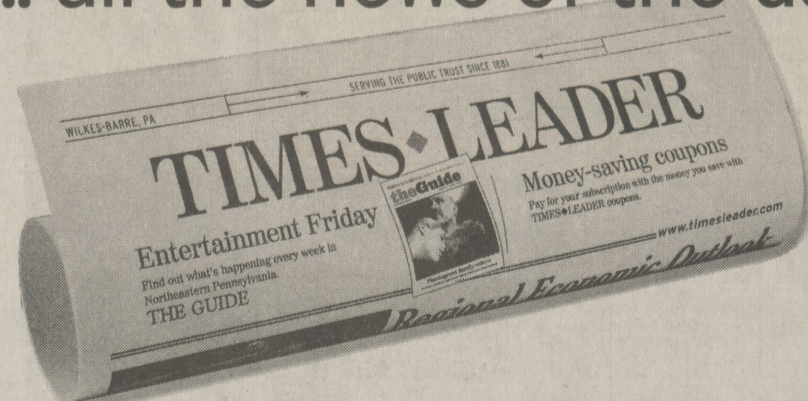
