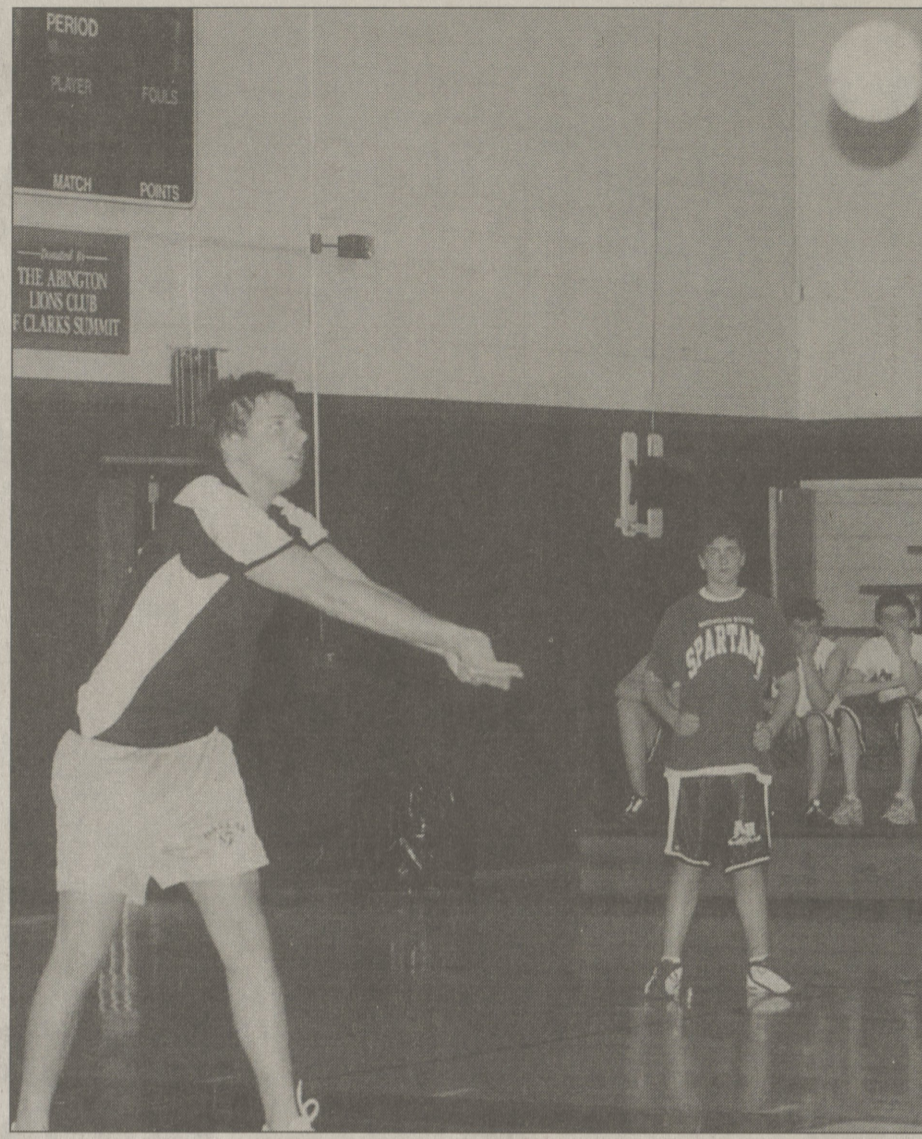


# How the ball bounces

# Mounts edge Lake-Lehman

LEHMAN TWP. - The Dallas Mountaineers won't break the defensive record they set last year.

Nor did anyone expect them to do so. But if Dallas remains as tough defensively as it was April 10, a few more goals here and there won't matter.

Dallas held Lake-Lehman scoreless until the final minutes and used two quick goals to post a 2-1 victory in Wyoming Valley Conference Division D girls soccer.

"Since Chris (Scharff) took over last year, they have been very tough to break down defensively," said Lehman co-coach Dave Elston, whose team fell to 2-1. Stephanie Frank scored Lehman's only goal in the 78th minute, making a run down the middle of the field off a lead pass by Jenna Elston.

The goal was the fourth Dallas (3-0) has surrendered this sea-

son after allowing only two during the entire 2001 WVC regular season.

"You can't go by how many goals we're going to give up this year," Scharff said. "Last year we had the best goalkeeper in the league and we went seven deep off the bench. This year, we have a freshman in goal who never played goalkeeper in her life and two players deep if that."

Dallas, though, still has an advantage in the form of two returning all-stars in the fullback line, Halli Williams and Janelle Opello.

Williams, the divisional MVP as a freshman last season, broke up a pass inside with about 10 seconds to play and Opello booted away Lehman's final chance after a desperation corner kick.

Caitlin Dukas gave Dallas a 1-0 lead in the first minute, converting a pass from Cait McGuire. Jen Toth assisted Jackie Hardwick with another goal six minutes later.
