Lynn M. Evans, of Vine Street, Oakhill, Dallas, died Wednesday April 10, 2002 at her home.




HARRY PRICE Born in Dallas and served in the U.S. Army Air Corps during World War II


Harry W. Price, 77, of Butler Street, Forty Fort, died Sunday April 14, 2002 at home.




