The Irem Temple Auditorium in Wilkes-Barre will be transformed into a lively storybook village as the theater hosts two productions of the ballet "Coppelia". Nearly 150 students from the Joan Harris Centre's Dallas Campus will help present the great comic work Sunday, April 21 at 1 and 5 p.m. This classic work is based on the book by Arthur Saint-Leon and Charles Nuitter. The three-act ballet was first performed at the Theatre Imperial de l'Opera in Paris in 1870 and since has enjoyed worldwide popularity as one of ballet's favorite comedies.

Sunday's performance of "Coppelia" is choreographed by Jackson Township resident, Elisabeth Harris, who most recently worked as the regional choreographer for the Moscow Ballet's production of the "The Great Russian Nutcracker." Choral Society to present Carmina Burana

The College Misericordia Choral Society will be presenting Carl Orff's masterpiece Carmina Burana on Tuesday, April 23 at 7:30 p.m.. The performance will take place at College Misericordia in Walsh Auditorium. Admission and parking are free, and the public is cordially invited.

The concert will begin with "Be Glad Then America," an anthem by early-American composer William Billings. Written to express the anxieties and fears of the days leading up to the American Revolution, it also rings true in any time our nation faces adversity and war. The Choral Society, directed by John Curtis, will be joined by three professional soloists, an ensemble of pianos and percussion instruments, and a children's chorus from Wyoming Seminary directed by Patty Paciotti. The

solists for this performance are Judy Ann Curtis, soprano, from Dallas, William Mulligan, tenor, from Scranton, and the internationally renowned Carlos Serrano, baritone, from Philadelphia.

Carmina Burana was composed by Carl Orff in 1937 using poetry written by itinerant 12th century German monks and wandering troubadours. The poems celebrate drinking, dancing, and love, with the overall theme that men and women are ruled by the fickle hand of fortune and fate. The music, at times rousing, sweet, mysterious, and always dramatic, has been hailed as one of the greatest choral masterworks of the 20th century.
