



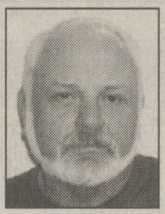
Country Music Gospel Group performs at Meadows

Game Lands Maintenance Worker George Nice of Sweet Valley, was recently promoted to Game Lands Maintenance Supervisor for the PA Game Commission's Ricketts Headquarters, SGL 57, Wyoming County.

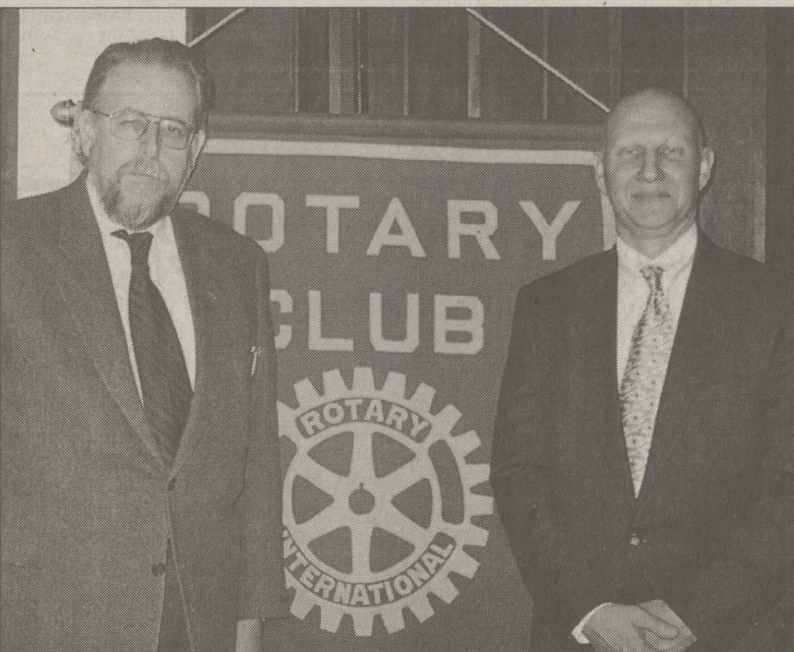

Game Lands Maintenance Supervisors are responsible for the development of new and or the maintenance of existing wildlife habitat areas on State Game Lands and on private lands through cooperative agreement with landowners. Work involves supervising Game Lands Maintenance Workers, often referred to

as Food and Cover workers, in maintenance and repair of equipment, facilities and grounds; operation of specialized equipment; or contacting landowners to secure agreements allowing for hunting and trapping on private land.

A 33-year veteran of the Game Commission, Nice will oversee projects on State Game Lands 13, 57 and 66 comprising over 55,000 acres that include 270 acres of existing fields, 58 miles of roads, 42 separate parking lots, several impoundments and one public shooting range. Private land holdings consist of 12,550 acres currently enrolled in the Game Commission's Farm-Game Projects within Luzerne and Wyoming counties.
