road would result in more traffic, and said it would also provide drivers along Manor Drive with a tempting shortcut to Carverton Road.

"An access road would now provide drivers (who want to get to Eighth Street) with a nice shortcut through (Sunrise Estates), and the residents of that development and myself, as well, don't want to see that happen. That is not an alternative as I see it. But if the (Kingston Township) Supervisors say I have to do it, I will."


Halbing instead thought the installation of an emergency access road, with a gate that would take only seconds for emergency personnel to open, would be a better fit, and would benefit both subdivisions in an emergency.

The developer said since Sunrise Estates has only one road into the development, emergency access between Windsor Farms and the existing neighborhood would provide a backup entrance for both.

"Unfortunately, because of the placement of (Windsor Farms), we don't have a choice," said Halbing. "I'm very aware of means of entry and exit. the concerns of the surround-

ing communities. "My first concern is with my 44 customers, and second with the surrounding homes. We must take all of these things into consideration, and come up with the best possible solution."

Steever also voiced concerns over what she said were waivers given to developments that had only one means of entry and exit. She said the township subdivision ordinance requires tension before a decision will be

But Township Supervisor John Versari said after speaking to township Zoning Officer Ben Gorey, there are no ordinances of that nature on record in the township.

"There is no ordinance stating that a development is required to have two means of entry and exit," said Versari. "Maple Crest was developed within the last five years, and it only has one entrance and exit.

plans, which preliminary passed unopposed, at the developments to have two made on the Windsor Farms board's special meeting of the

township Board of Supervisors April 19.

The proposal overturned an earlier vote by the board, which denied Halbing and his associates a 30-day extension before the Supervisors would decide on approving the subdivisions preliminary plans or not.

"After reading different situations throughout the country similar to this one, our legal counsel recommended that we should take that avenue," said Versari. "It would also give (Halbing) extra time to rectify the problems in his original plan."

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
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
