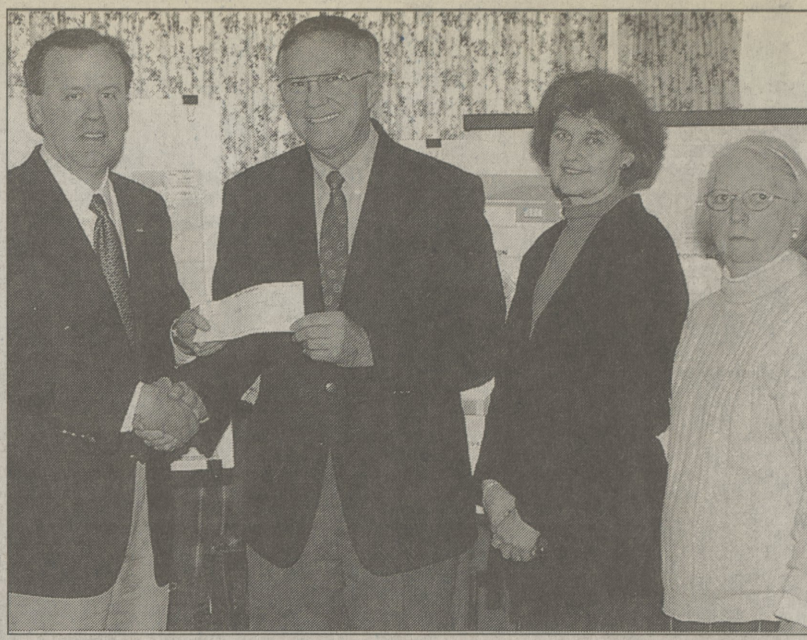

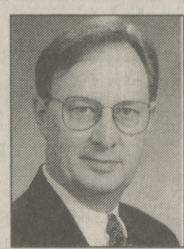
Godparents were Donald Fleschut, paternal uncle and Kimberly Krupsha maternal aunt.
