WILLIAM P. ORR III

Retired from E.I. DuPont as comptroller of International Department

William P. Orr III, 90, of Dallas, died Friday, May 3, 2002 at his home in Palm Beach, Fla. He also resided in Wilmington, Del. He was born and raised in Lewes, Del. He graduated from the Episcopal High School in Alexandria, Va., and attended the U.S. Naval Academy. He retired from E.I. du Pont de Nemours & Co. in 1974 as comptroller of the International Department. He joined the company in 1940, as one of the original members of the Foreign Relations Department. He served in various capacities and, after a short assignment in Lima, Peru, was transferred in 1947 to Buenos Aires, Argentina, where he was assistant treasurer and later treasurer of DuPont's subsidiary (Ducilo). He became assistant general manager of Ducilo in 1956 and two years later returned to DuPont's headquarters in Wilmington, Del., where he held several financial posts within the Latin American Division and later the International Department. Before joining DuPont, Mr. Orr was employed at the Equitable Trust Company in Wilmington and, from 1937 to 1940, was treasurer of P.J. Nowland, Inc., Wilmington. He was past president of

the American Chamber of Commerce in Buenos Aires and past president of the Church Club of Delaware. He served as finance committee chairman of Trinity Episcopal Church of Wilmington. He was a member of the Everglades Club and the Bath and Tennis Club, both of Palm Beach, Fla.; the Wilmington Club and the Wilmington Country Club, both of Wilmington, Del.; and the Westmoreland Club of Wilkes-Barre, Pa. Mr. Orr was married for 49 years to the former Amy Kirkpatrick of Wilmington. She died in 1988. Mr. Orr was remarried to the former Geraldine Nesbitt of Dallas, Pa., in 1988.

He is survived by his second wife; his brother, Robert Orr of Lewes, Del.; four children by his first marriage (Amy Lear of Millersville, Pa., and Lewes, Del.; William P. Orr IV of Teaneck, N.J.; Jane Drevco of Germantown, Md.; John Orr of Paoli, Pa.); one step-son (Abram Nesbitt III of Dallas, Pa.); eight grandchildren and two step-grandchildren; one great-grandson and one step-great-granddaughter.
