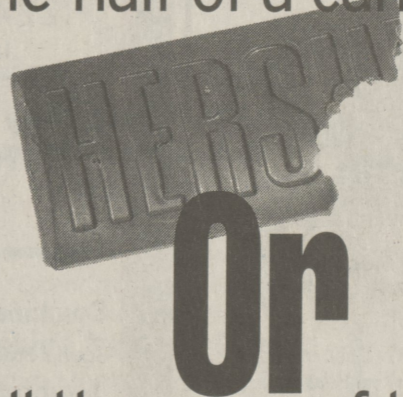
Middle School bond winners
