## **American Red Cross says** blood shortage not over

Blood collections have improved slightly, but the American Red Cross reported today the blood shortage in northeastern and central Pennsylvania still exists.

"We have seen donor turnout at our blood drives improve," said Molly Groody, Red Cross spokesperson. "But there is still a blood shortage in this area. We will need to see several more weeks of good collections to bring the blood inventory up to a safe level. And those collections must continue to avoid slipping back to a critical inventory situation again.'

A three-day blood supply is considered the safe minimum supply to have on hand to supply hospital patients. American Red Cross Blood Services, Northeastern Pennsylvania Region's (NEPA) blood inventory has not yet reached that minimum safe level.

"There is still less than a two-day blood supply available for patients in the 40 hospitals we service," Groody said. "No one should get the impression this blood shortage is over. We are grateful to all those who have responded by giving blood. We hope people realize this is still a critical situation and continue to make giving blood a priority.'

Anyone who is at least 17 years old, who weighs at least 105 pounds, and is in general good health, can give blood.
