

Among the techniques students learned were fingerprint analysis, blood testing/typing, and DNA analysis of hair, fibers, seeds and beetles. Participants also learned forensic anthropology techniques by studying human bones, collected evidence from an outdoor "crime scene," and met with a scientist from the Wyoming State Police Crime Lab.


