The Penn State Wilkes-Barre and Hazleton campuses will hold an engineering exam review for civil engineering professionals who plan to take the Professional Engineer Examination to become registered professional engineers in Pennsylvania. Review sessions include three phases of engineering covered by the examination.

The program reviews pertinent engineering and scientific concepts. Development of problem-solving skills is emphasized, and questions from past examinations are carefully examined. Instructor, Thomas Schleffer, PE, will also cover topics including highways and surveying, hydraulics, sanitary, structures, engineering economics, and soils.


