Kingston Twp. warns of potential West Nile Virus infestation

The Kingston Township Zoning Officer reminds the residents of Kingston Township that it is unlawful to have any collection of standing water, except for agricultural purposes, in which mosquitoes are likely to breed, unless such collection of water is treated or maintained to prevent such breeding.

The Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection and Health warn that there is a chance the West Nile Virus could be spread into Pennsylvania this summer by the common mosquito. Township residents are requested to eliminate

from their property any accumulation of stagnant water to help prevent the spread of mosquitoes.

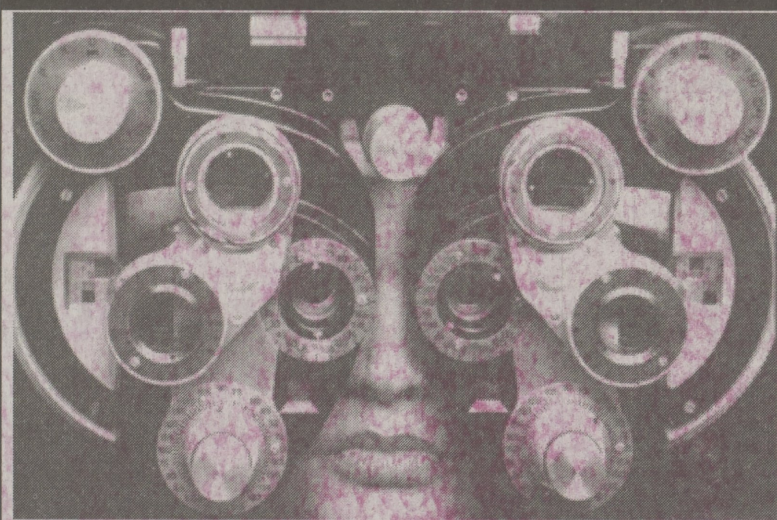

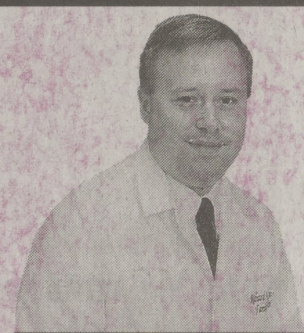
