Early in the first quarter, the Crusaders forced Lake-Lehman to punt from its 39. Mark Yankowski's punt hit his own player in the back. Coughlin's Lenny Sarnick scooped up the ball and returned it 32 yards for the game's first touchdown.

The closest the Black Knights came to scoring during the first half was late in the second quarter. On third-and-seven from the Lehman 22, Coughlin quarterback John Vincarelli was intercepted by Brandon Burkhardt. Burkhardt returned the pick 80 yards to the end zone, but it was called back on a holding penalty. After Coughlin took a 20-0

lead, Lehman finally got on the board. The biggest play during the 64-yard drive was a 9-yard pass from Brian Cornia to Brandon Wren on third-and-9 from the Crusader 11 yard line. After the Coughlin defense stuffed two Dave Harris runs, Burkhardt scored a 2-yard
