Gamelands tour set for Oct. 6

DALLAS — As part of the Pennsylvania Game Commission's efforts to highlight its ongoing habitat improvement initiatives, the public is invited to take part in tours of State Game Lands (SGLs) in October in the Northeast Region.

"State Game Lands tours provide the opportunity for those who enjoy nature to come out and talk with the people, our Land Management Officers and Food and Cover Corps crews, who are directly responsible for the various land management practices taking place," said Barry Warner, Northeast Regional Director.

A tour of gamelands in Luzerne and Wyoming counties will be held Sunday, October 6. Registration will held from 7:30 a.m. until 12:30 p.m. at the headquarters building complex on SGL #57, Ricketts Station,

Forkston Township, Wyoming County. Game Commission personnel will be on hand to explain various points of interest, including wildlife habitat improvement projects. Four-wheel-drive vehicles are recommended for this three-hour, 30-mile, self-guided driving tour.

Directions: Take Route 487 north at the intersection of Route 118 and proceed 7.5 miles and turn onto a dirt road near SGL sign on right. Travel on dirt road 1/10 mile to a "Y" intersection and proceed left 3/10 miles to the headquarters complex. Each vehicle will be provided a map and brief explanation of wildlife management programs being carried out on this magnificent tract of public hunting land.

Roads are passable for most vehicles.
