Pittston wins Monday afternoon football

DALLAS — Matt Pisano's 88-yard touchdown run with 1:43 to play sealed Pittston Area's 23-13 victory over Dallas Monday afternoon, in a game postponed from Saturday due to wet field conditions.

The run gave Pisano a season-best 259 yards on 31 rushes for the game. It also left him 50 yards shy of 1,000 for the season.

"He's a horse. One guy can't take the kid down," Dallas coach Ted Jackson said. "He runs hard on every play, he's physical, he plays defense and returns kicks. He's the ultimate high school football player." The run came two plays

after defensive back Joe Consagra intercepted a Dallas pass in the end zone, uelling a Mountaineer drive that started at the Dallas 8-yard line. The Mountaineers also moved into Pittston Area territory midway through the fourth quarter, but Patriot defensive tackle Nick Levy stalled the drive with a sack on a third-and-8 play.

"It was very similar to Wyoming Area," said Jackon, referring to a 6-0 Dalas loss on Sept. 13. "We couldn't make the plays in the fourth quarter to win the game."

Dallas moved within 16-13 with 1:48 left in the third quarter. Ryan Bolton returned a punt 36 yards to the Patriot 18 and scored on the next play on a pitch from shotgun formation. Downfield blocks by receivers Mike Racoski and Jon Barbose cleared Bolton's path to the end

Dallas had envisioned the 6-foot-4 Racoski and 6-foot-3 Barbose creating mismatches against the Pittston Area secondary. And while the Mountaineers ad some success, they never fully exploited the height differential.
