LEHMAN TWP. — Carla Chiampi, a Lake-Lehman midfielder, has given a verbal commitment to accept an athletic scholarship from Ball State University. Meredith Edwards, a forward, has done the same with the University of Louisville.

A verbal commitment is not binding, and the two can change their minds until they sign a national letter of intent in early February. It does end the recruiting process for each student-athlete, as coaches and scouts from other schools won't try to sway their decision. The two had been looking at some of the same schools. Chiampi had also considered the University of Maine, the University of New Hampshire and Miami of Ohio. Edwards had narrowed her choices to Louisville and Maine.

"It is one less thing to worry about, but now that I know where I am going, I want to keep improving my game so I can go in there strong," Edwards said. "I've actually stepped up my play."

Chiampi has come through in the clutch numerous times as well, although her contributions aren't always obvious. She has one goal and six assists this season.
