out the window when rivals such as Dallas and Lake-Lehman play each other. Jackson isn't one of them. "We got tired of hearing all week about how records don't matter," said the Mountaineer coach. "We believe records do matter. We work our tails off all winter and summer to win games in a very physical league. We've worked very hard and put in a lot of hours to get to this point." Bolton, who finished with 81 yards on 11 carries, scored on a pair of short runs to give the Mountaineers a 14-0 lead with five minutes remaining in the first half. After a short punt gave Dallas possession on the Black Knights' 33-yard line, Gryskewicz con-

nected with Barbose on a 33-yard touchdown pass to make it 20-0. The Dallas quarterback completed eight passes for 122 yards and three touchdowns. "We knew Gryskewicz was an excellent quarterback and he showed that today," said Lake-Lehman coach Bob Langan. "Give Dallas credit. They played a great defensive football game and (Gryskewicz) controlled the game." The Dallas defense held the Black Knights to 113 yards of

total offense, including 95 rushing yards by tailback Dave Harris. The senior completed the season with more than 1,100 rushing yards. "We wanted to play well defensively, especially the seniors," said senior Steve Salavantis, who has five quarterback sacks in his last two games. "We knew Harris is a very good running back and runs the ball very hard. To get a shutout is just amazing." Gryskewicz tossed a 7-yard

touchdown pass to Hayes and a 6-yarder to Racoski in the second half to close out the scoring. Lake-Lehman began the third quarter with three consecutive penalties and had five penalties for 42 yards, including three personal fouls, in the first two minutes of the second half. "We made a lot of mental mistakes," said Langan. "We got caught up in the stuff that was going on and we shot ourselves in the foot. We had a number of penalties and that really hurt us."

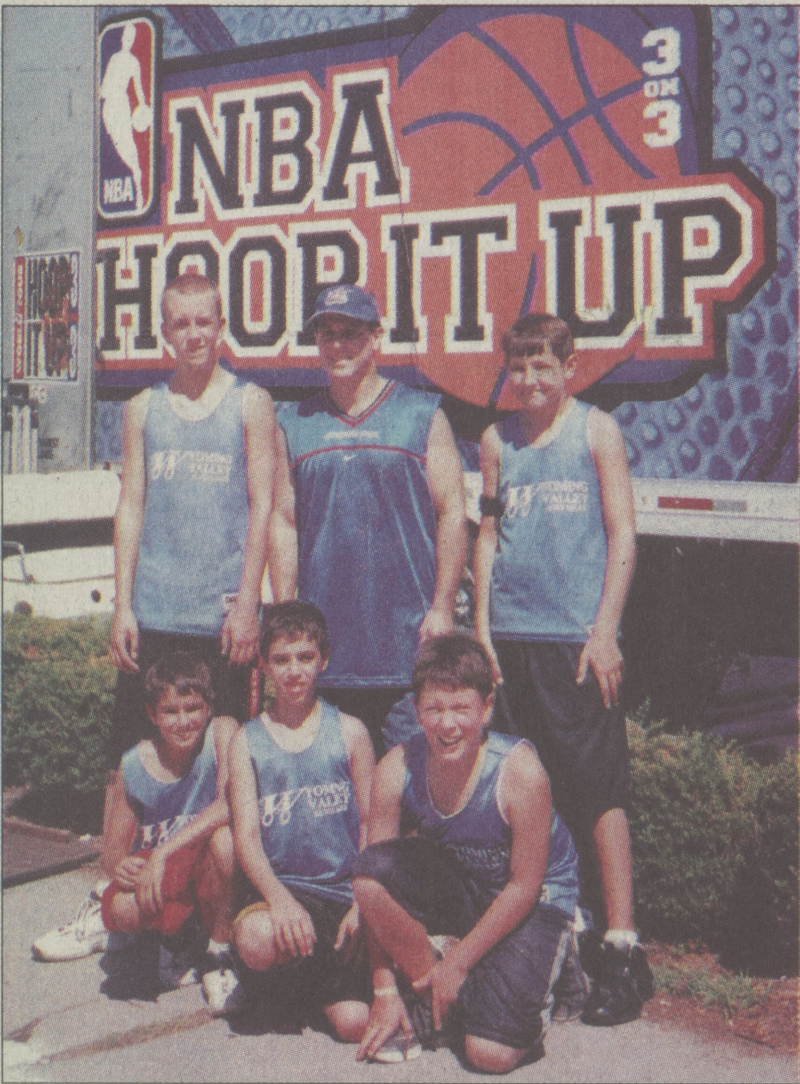
DHS Softball Booster Club plans to meet

Pheasants releases made in area

Pennsylvania Game Commission employees in the Northeast Region began releasing pheasants on State Game Lands and other suitable properties open to public hunting to provide quality game bird hunting opportunities. The general small game season opened November 2, and closes on November 30. The late small game season will run December 16-24, and December 26 through February 8. In addition to State Game Lands, the 26,980 pheasants (9,700 cockbirds and 17,280 hens) are scheduled to be released through five separate stockings on areas enrolled in the agency's public access program (Farm Game and Safety Zone), and certain state parks and federal lands with suitable habitat. The agency's pheasant propagation program was started in hopes of establishing self-sus-

taining pheasant populations. However, numerous studies have shown that, although a few birds may survive long enough to reproduce, viable wild populations have not resulted. Stocking areas for the individual counties follow. For information on pheasant stockings planned in other regions, visit the Game Commission's website (www.pgc.state.pa.us) and click on Hunting Information, and choose 2002 Pheasant Stockings by County. Luzerne: SGL 119 near Francis Walter Reservoir, SGL 91, SGL 187, Farm-Game Projects 6 & 156, and Safety Zone Cooperators in Exeter, Franklin, Huntington, Lehman, Kingston, Plymouth, Ross and Salem townships, and New Columbus Borough; Farm-Game projects 226 in southeastern end of county and 187 along the Nescopeck Creek.
