Accomplished folk singers Meyer and Cosgrove to appear at Chicory House

One of the top acts on the European folk scene, Liz Meyer and Mark Cosgrove, will offer their high-powered acoustic music at Wilkes-Barre's Chicory House on Friday, November 22. Performing mostly original songs that combine bluegrass, folk, country, rock and blues influences, Meyer and Cosgrove began touring together, primarily in Europe, in 1998. Meyer is an award-winning songwriter whose songs have been recorded by Emmylou Harris, Kate MacKenzie, and other artists in 10 countries. Cosgrove is best known as a virtuoso guitarist, a winner of the U.S. National Flatpicking Guitar Championship and the prestigious Doc Watson Flatpicking Guitar Competition. The duo is recognized for their spellbinding live performances; Meyer is a singer of exquisite taste and sensitivity and Cosgrove's guitar work is notable

not only for power, precision and wonderful tone, but for his fluid high-speed improvisation. Meyer's musical versatility, both as a singer and songwriter, gives Cosgrove the perfect medium to demonstrate the many facets of his guitar playing. He carries the lead work effortlessly, and Meyer revels in the musical freedom which the duo format allows her vocally. Every song is presented with both passion and technical virtuosity. The concert begins at 8 p.m.; doors open at 7:30. Admission is \$12, or \$9 for supporting members of Chicory House. Chicory House concerts are held in the Community Room at St. Stephen's Church, 35 South Franklin Street, Wilkes-Barre, across from Boscov's parking lot. Refreshments will be available.
