The goal of the Cum Laude Society is the encouragement and rewarding of academic excellence. Wyoming Seminary's chapter of the society was established in 1930, and each year since then, previous members of the organization elect new senior class members in both fall and spring. The students elected in the fall must have a junior-year average of at least 3.4 (out of a possible 4.0); the spring inductees must have attained a cumulative junior- and senior-year average of at least 3.1.

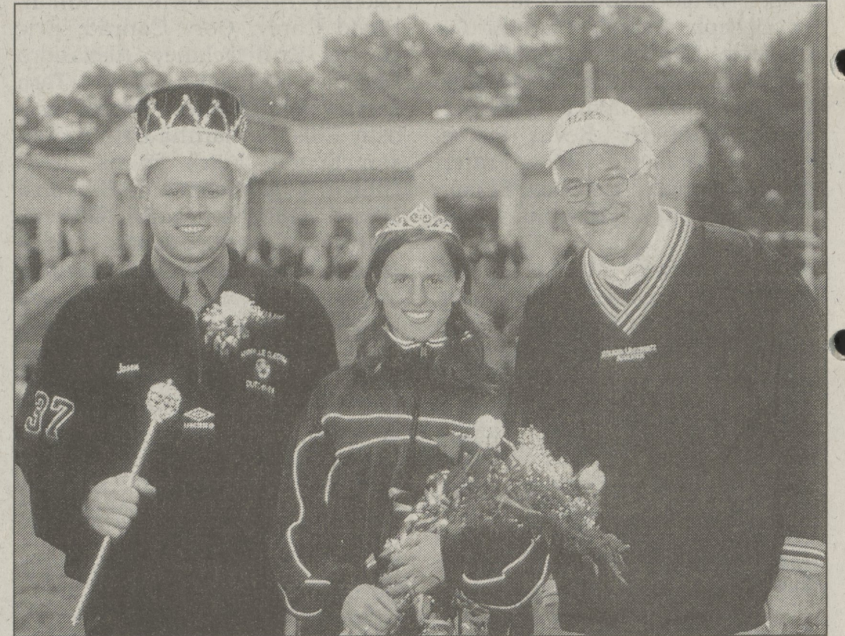
Bednarz, Strasser honored at Bucknell
