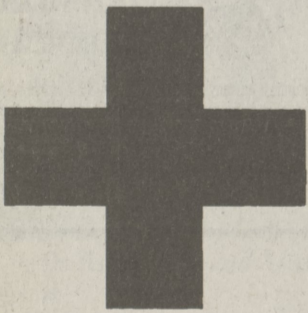
The holiday reminds us to this day that we share the legacy of those first settlers, and that we should never forget how fortunate we are.
