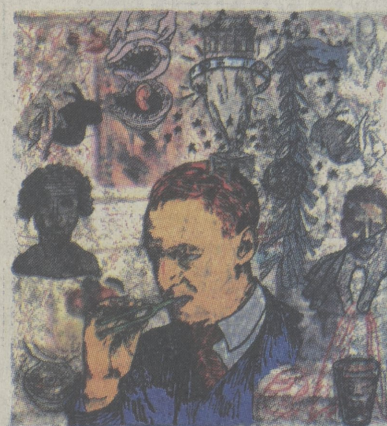

Concert features 'Peter and the Wolf'

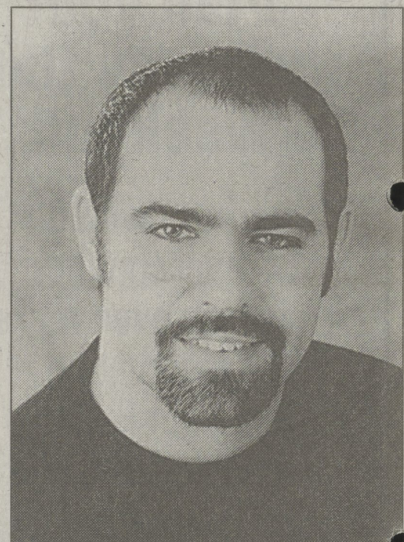
