However, with just seconds remaining, Renninger wound up on top of Dragon and nearly got control. Nearly on his back, Dragon was unsure what happened as time expired.

"I got a little scared. I didn't know if I won or lost," said Dragon, who came dangerously close to giving up a reversal or back points.

Dragon, who enjoyed a stand-

out freshman year but failed to make states last season, is hoping the tournament will lead to better things.

"I'm happy I could wrestle well and prove myself," Dragon said. "This will give me some confidence, but I can't slack off."

The Riley-Weber bout was a study in contrasting styles. Riley, at 6-foot-5-plus, is tall and lean while Weber is stocky and chiseled. It was paramount for one wrestler to force their will on the other.

"I'm not going to change my style for every kid I wrestle,"

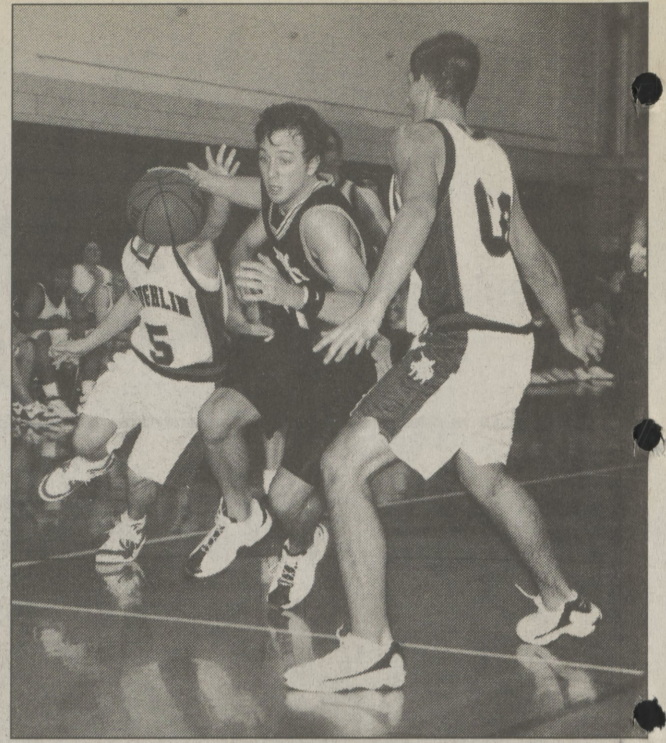
said Riley. "I knew it was going to be tough. The outcome went my way this time."

Weber came out firing, scoring a takedown just 10 seconds into the bout but Riley hung tough and eventually turned a 3-1 first-period deficit into a 9-3 lead before hitting a power-half and matting Weber.

Riley seemed stronger than he was as a district runner-up last season, which obviously played a role in his ability to wrap up a very strong Weber.

Other Lake-Lehman place winners were John Houssock, third at 119; Jon Schutz, fourth at 125 and Ryan Post, seventh at 130.
