


Dallas coach Mark Lacey sketched out a play.

The Crusaders, who finished second in the Commonwealth Conference with a 6-1 league mark, advanced to the NCAA Division III Tournament for the third time in program history before falling 1-0 to College of New Jersey in second-round action on November 16.

During the season, the Crusaders established single-season program records for victories (17), longest winning streak (15) and goals

scored (66). Bartolini played in three games this season, helping the Crusader

tolini of Dallas








