GIRLS SWIMMING

Dallas swamps Meyers at home

DALLAS — Dallas won 11 of 12 events, led by Jen Arthur's first-place finishes in the 50 and 100 freestyle, and walloped Meyers 119-67 Monday night.

Arthur was also part of the winning 200 and 400 freestyle relay teams. Annie Savage (first in the 200 and 500 freestyle) joined Arthur on the 400 freestyle relay team and teammate Lacey Cooper (first in 100 backstroke, 200 individual medley) teamed with Arthur in the 200 freestyle relay. Lynn Kirkwood won the 100 butterfly and Alyssa Retzena took the 100 breast stroke.

Delaware Valley 97, Dallas 89

DALLAS — Delaware Valley finished first in seven of 12 events.

Dallas's Jen Arthur finished first in the 50 and 100 freestyle races and was on the winning 200 medley relay and 400 freestyle relay teams. Alyssa Retzena won the 100 breast stroke.

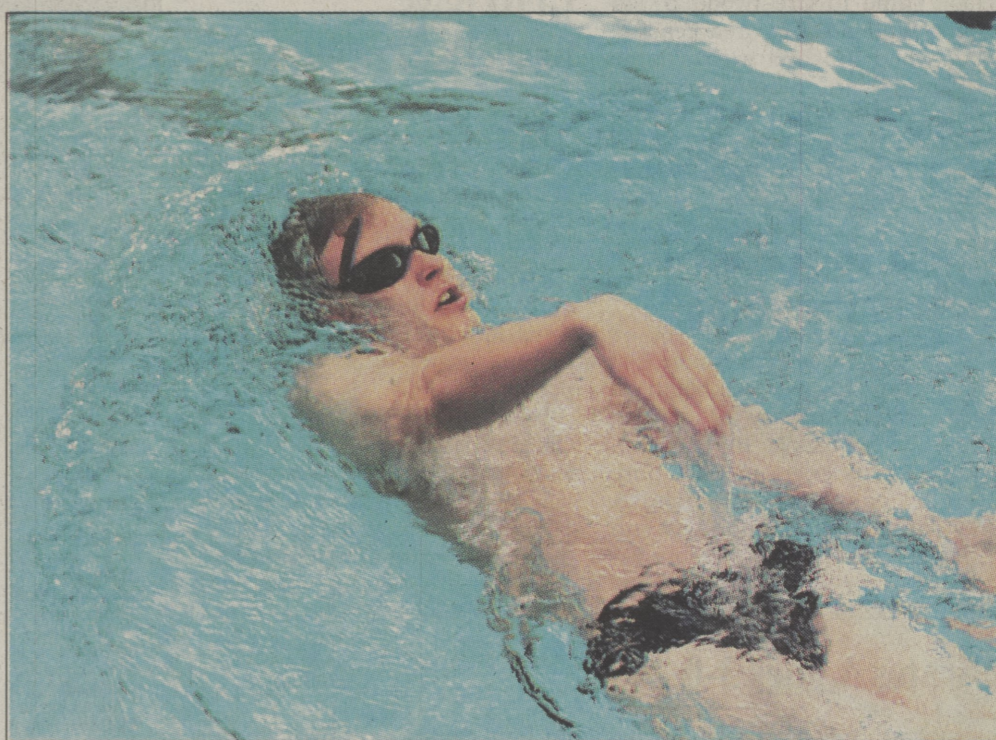

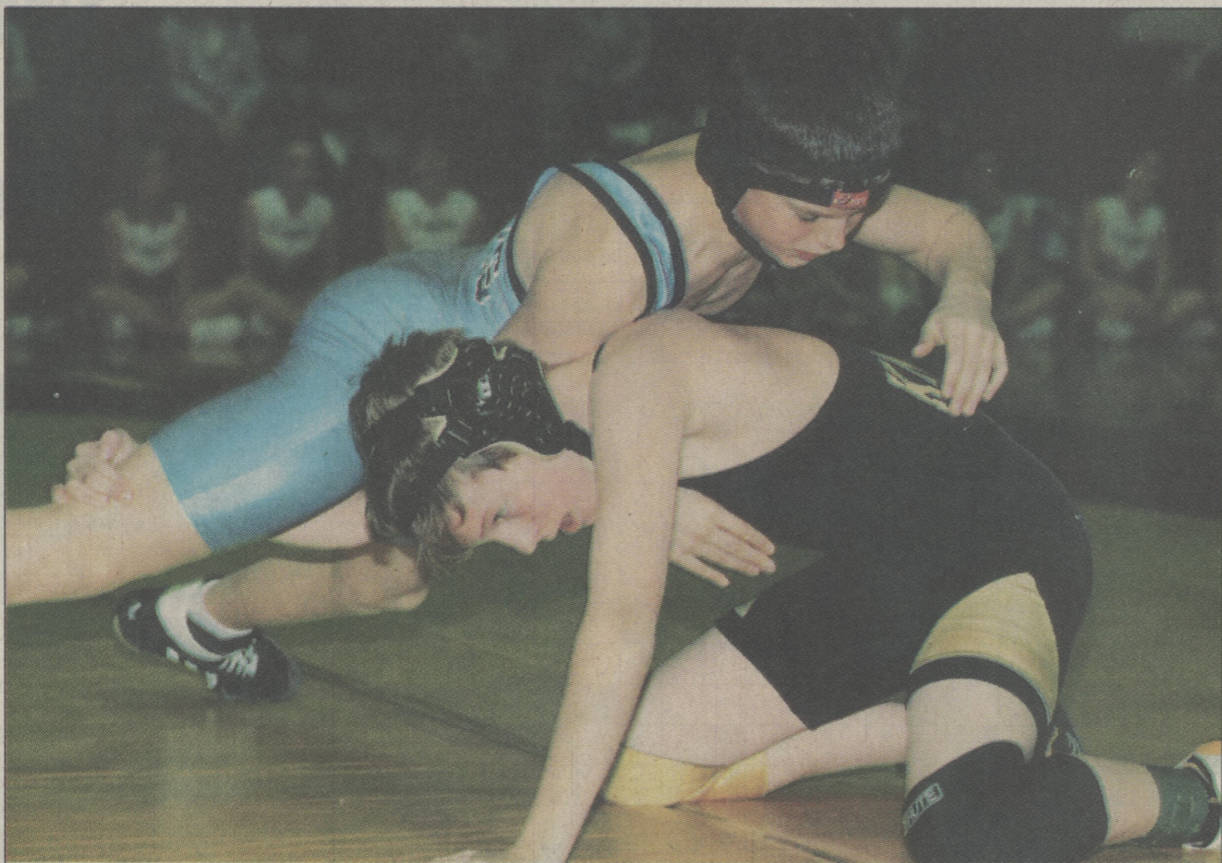
Lacey Cooper came up for air during the 200 meter individual medley relay during the Dallas swim meet against Delaware Valley last week. She finished second in the event.

Harveys Lake Little League registration
