Kozick said the resident of Lake Way Drive was told the township would have to initiate the process before PennDOT could take any action.

Jolley said the area does not have a high frequency of accidents, but, he said, PennDOT looks at a variety of other factors when considering such a re-

Also during the meeting, Jason Jolley, a sophomore at Dallas High School and member of Boy Scout Troop 281, requested permission from the board to create a walking path at the Dallas Township Recreation Park. Jolley said creating the path is part of his effort to obtain the rank of Eagle Scout. The board approved the idea.






