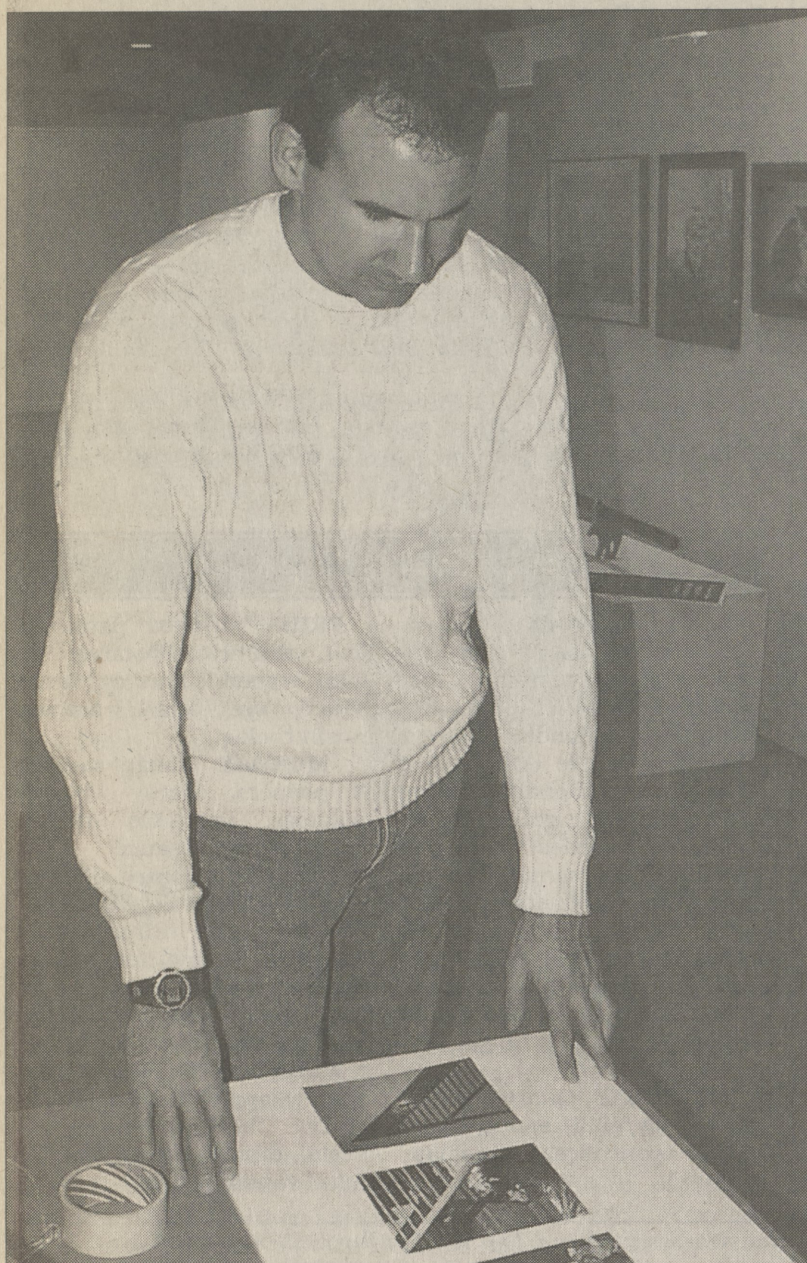

The stream cleanup event has been scheduled for Saturday, April 26 with registration beginning at 8 a.m. Volunteer groups who may be interested in participating in this event are invited to call the office to pre-register for this event and to have registration mailed to them.

The 2003 event will be the third annual cleanup held in the

Wyoming Valley. The first event, held in 2001 had 100 volunteers removing 12.98 tons of trash from Toby Creek, Newport Creek, Nanticoke Creek and Solomon's Creek. In 2002 the program disposed of 18 tons of debris.

## Penn State Wilkes-Barre offering SAT review course

High school students can register now for Penn State Wilkes-Barre's verbal and math review course for the Scholastic Assessment Tests (SAT) to be given on April 5 and May 3. This course, presented in cooperation with Cambridge Educational Services, Inc., offers high school students a seven-session, grade-free course to prepare for the verbal and math portions of the SAT. It provides information on

the current format of the SAT, and instructs students in test-taking techniques to help them realize their full potential on the test. The review course will address crucial test issues including solving analogy problems, increasing reading comprehension, familiarity with the math grid and when to use a calculator, advantages and disadvantages of guessing, and other test-taking strategies.

The SAT review course will be held on Saturdays, beginning February 8 through March 22 from 10 a.m.-1 p.m., in the Athletics and Recreation building on the campus in Lehman.

Students may take one or
