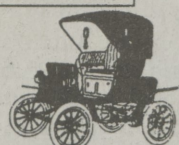

Estimates for the work by an excavation contractor sometime ago, placed the cost of the work at well over \$1,500. Due to the volunteer workers, this cost has been cut to almost a sixth of this amount.

SCHOOL DISTRICT TO JOIN BOARD IN TAXING UNITS
 Dallas Area School District will join Kingston Township Supervisors in an effort to collect real estate payments from Luzerne County Housing Authority, operating a 100 family unit at Meadowcrest. No remuneration is being sought from occupants of the homes, who are paying a per capita tax of \$13 per adult, with the exception of those inhabiting the dwellings for short periods.
 Back Mountain Library Association executive board announces that a new librarian has been procured. She is Miss Elizabeth Ryder, Lancaster, with 33 years of library experience.
 A burglar surprised in the act slipped out the back door of Clifford Garris' home, before he could be identified. Returning from church, Mrs. Garris was entering the front door, when she

heard the back door shut. She found the bedroom ransacked. Nothing was taken.
30 Years Ago - March 1, 1973
DALLAS ROUTS COMETS 52-0 CLINCH FIRST LEAGUE TITLE
 Jim Bamrick's Mountaineers shut out the Crestwood Comets 52-0 while the Valley West Spartans conquered Hanover 30-19 to give the Back Mountain grappers their first league title in the history of the school.
 Pennsylvania Gas & Water Co., liquid propane customers await April 1, when the price they pay for that fuel will more than double. From individual complaints to the bureaucracy to organizing into protest groups to a class action suit which asks \$10,000 in total damages for each customer affected, the consumer is making his voice heard.
