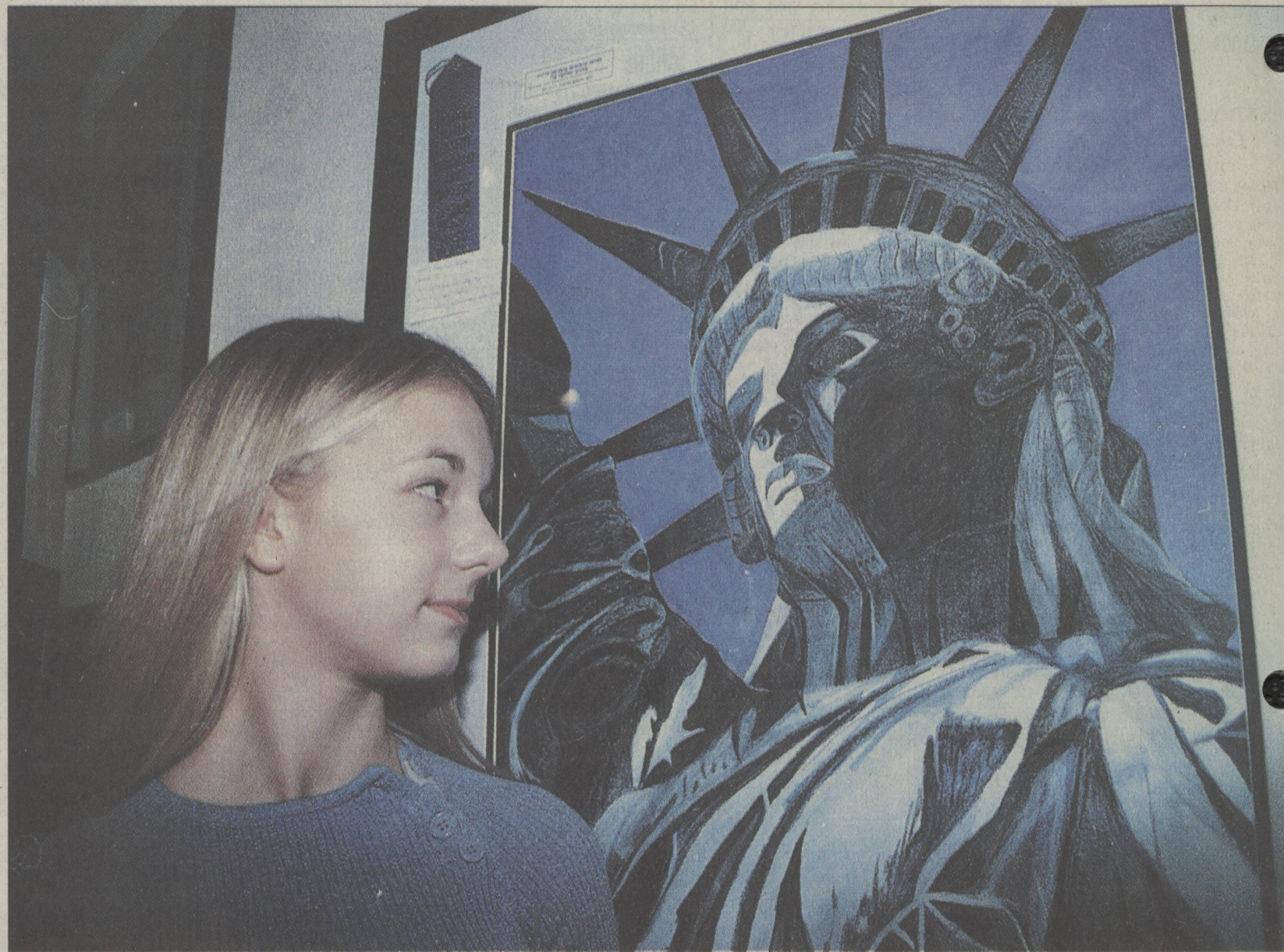

22nd Rosetti Art Show opens March 11
