Black Knights regain momentum in Back Mt. Cup race

Lake-Lehman recovered from a winter sports losing streak to pick up the latest victory in the race for the inaugural

Back Mountain Cup. The powerful Black Knights boys volleyball team walloped the Mountaineers March 31, moving the standings to 9-5 in Lehman's favor.

After a very slow start, Dallas got its first victory against its Back Mountain rivals in the Old Shoe football game. After losing the first event of the winter sea-

son in wrestling, the Mountaineers reeled off four consecutive victories in basketball to make the race competitive.

The schools are scheduled for a big day April 14, when they play each other in softball, baseball and tennis. Two days later the girls soccer teams will meet at Lehman.

The Cup is not intended to diminish the importance of the Old Shoe football game, or the more recent awards given by Back Mountain Youth Soccer to the winning soccer team. It includes every regular-season game, match and meet in which the schools play one another, awarding one point for each victory and .5 point to each school in a tie. There is no distinction

made between a win in volleyball, football or track — all will be equally important.

The winning school will be treated to a cookout after the final game between the two schools next spring, and will hold possession of the Cup trophy until the completion of the next year's seasons. A collection of non-perishable food items will be held in connection with the event. The general public and local sports celebrities will be invited to attend, in a spirit of healthy celebration.
