Seminary Players present 'Angel Street'

A diabolical plot to drive a young wife insane and find a missing treasure is the focus of a gripping drama to be presented by the Wyoming Seminary Players in May.

"Angel Street," a Victorian thriller written by Patrick Hamilton, will be performed on Friday, May 2 and Saturday, May 3 at 8 p.m. in Wyoming Seminary's Buckingham Performing Arts Center, North Sprague Avenue, Kingston. Tickets will be sold at the door and are \$3 for adults, \$2 for students.

In the story, Mr. Manningham, a handsome businessman who appears to treat his younger wife with great kindness, is slowly driving his wife insane by accusing her of forgetting or misplacing household items. Because Mrs. Manningham lost her mother to insanity, she is easily convinced she is losing her mind. During one of Mr. Manningham's absences, a police inspector comes to visit Mrs. Manningham and eventually convinces her that her husband is a killer, interested only in removing so he can search their home for some valuable jewels. The methods the police inspector uses to trap Mr. Manningham provide the play's riveting suspense.

The play, written by Hamilton in London in 1939, was originally titled "Gaslight," but was later renamed "Angel Street" when it was presented on Broadway in 1941. The movie thriller "Gaslight" featured Charles Boyer and Ingrid Bergman.

"This play is exciting and appealing to audiences because, with the right pacing, it is full of suspense. You don't know what will happen," said W. Carver Collins, director. "The audience sees this woman, Mrs. Manningham, trapped on stage, unable to move on her own, and the audience has the feeling of being trapped as well."
