Black Knights 2nd at track invitational

SHIPPENSBURG — Lake-Lehman finished second with 47 points in the Class 2A boys High School Track and Field Invitational, held April 19 at Shippensburg University.

Brad Baird led Lehman with wins in the 3,200 (9:41.64) and steeplechase (6:23.94). Also for the Black Knights, Brandon Burkhardt was second in the discus (139-5) and third in the shot put (45-5 1/2). George Lazur was fourth in the discus (131-2) and Aaron Moyer was fifth in the 300 hurdles (43.85).

Lehman's Preston Smith was fifth in the high jump (5-10) sixth in the long jump (20-0) and triple jump (39-11), teammates Nate Carsman and Phil Kasper were fifth and sixth, respectively, in the pole vault with heights of 12-6 and Black Knight Corey Norton was seventh in the 400 (54.67).

For Dallas, Steve Salavantis was seventh in the shot put (45-8) and javelin (167-4).

In 2A girls action, Dallas took eighth with 28 points.

Dallas won the 3,200 relay (10:22.14), and Mountaineer Lisa Giacometti took first (11:46.39) in the 3,200, followed by teammate Whitney Adams, who took third in 12:06.34.

Leading Lake-Lehman was Allison Boris, third in the 400 (1:03.80); and Annie Sorchik, who was fourth in the javelin (109-7). Lehman was fifth in the 3,200 relay (10:42.98) and Black Knight Kim Chollak took sixth in the high jump (4-8).

Lake-Lehman gets one back as spring season nears end

The Lake-Lehman Black Knights got one back last week, beating Dallas in girls soccer to take a two-game lead in the race for the inaugural Back Mountain Cup.

Lehman goes into Thursday's track and field meet with a 10-8 lead over the Mountaineers.

The Black Knights won the first seven events last fall before Dallas got its first victory in the Old Shoe football game. After losing in wrestling, the Mountaineers reeled off four consecutive victories in basketball to make the race competitive. Then, Dallas won all three games played April 14 to edge closer.

The Cup includes every regular-season game, match and meet

in which the schools play one another, awarding one point for each victory and .5 point to each school in a tie. There is no distinction made between a win in volleyball, football or track — all are equally important.



The winning school will be treated to a cookout after the final game between the two schools, and will

hold possession of the Cup trophy until the completion of the next year's seasons. A collection of non-perishable food items will be held in connection with the event. The general public and local sports celebrities will be invited to attend, in a spirit of healthy celebration.
