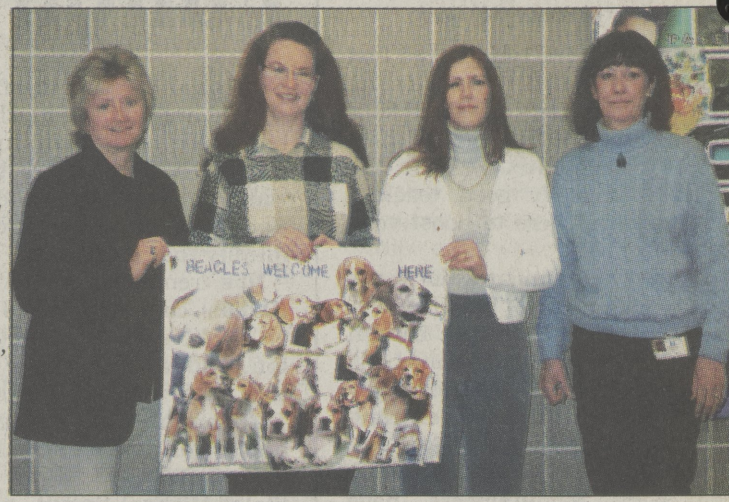
Dallas High's annual SPCA drive
