

Rec park gains \$200,000 grant

LEHMAN TWP. — Construction of soccer fields, set to begin this summer, recently received a boost. The Pennsylvania Department of Conservation and Natural Resources (DCNR) has awarded Back Mountain Recreation a \$200,000 Community Recreation Grant for the further development of the Back Mountain Regional Recreation Complex.

Applied for by the Back Mountain Recreation Board in October 2002, the grant announced May 2 will be used for further construction of soccer fields.

'We're thrilled to get it, it's going to mean a few more fields getting built," said Brian Grove, new executive director of Back


Mountain Recreation Inc. A press release about the grant stated, "With the help of DCNR, the PA Department of Community and Economic Development, local foundations and private donors, BMR has acquired the property for the complex and is in the process of finalizing engineering and design. The bidding process for the construction of the first athletic field is scheduled to occur

June, with construction commencing in August." "We are thrilled with the continued enthusiasm and strong level of support for our project from the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and all of our community partners. This new revenue will be directed to the first phases of construction of the athletic facilities and infrastructure that will get underway

this summer," said Dave Sutton, President of the Back Mountain Recreation Board.

You can use trail on property

The Back Mountain Recreation property is now open for public use. When visiting, park near the large sign on Lehman-Outlet Road. There are trails throughout the wooded hilly acreage. The property won't have official property markers for some weeks, so be cognizant of neighbors' "no trespassing" and "private property" signs. No hunting or all terrain vehicles are permitted.
