## Lake-Lehman boys take 5th, Carsman, Kasper 1-2 in pole vault

**MOSCOW** — Lake-Lehman went 1-2 in the pole vault at the District 2 Class 2A Track and Field Championships, held May 15, as Nate Carsman and Phil Kasper both cleared 12-6. Carsman won the gold because he had fewer misses. The Black Knights finished third in the team standings, out of 18 teams.

Brandon Burkhardt was a triple medal winner in throwing events. He was sixth in the shot put (45-0); fourth in discus (147-7); and fifth in javelin (166-4).

Other Lehman medal winners were: Corey Norton, sixth in the 800 (2:05:28); Brad Baird, second in the 3200 (9:35:66); Joel Mazur, sixth in the 300 hurdles (42.84); Phil Kasper, fifth in the long jump (19-8 3/4) and fourth in the javelin throw (167-3).

The 3200 relay team finished third in 8:31:16 and the 1600 relay team was fifth at 4:27.43.

On the girls' side, Lake-Lehman finished 11th of 18 teams. Individual standouts were Ashlee Leonard, sixth in the 200 meter dash (28.48); Allison Boris, fourth in the 400 (1:02.4); Meredith Edwards, sixth in the 3200 (12:47.55); Kim Chollak, fifth in the long jump (15-11); Leah Vnuk, sixth in the discus (89-10); Annie Sorchik, second in javelin (114-4).

## Giacometti runs off with girls 3200 gold

**MOSCOW** — Dallas freshman Lisa Giacometti won gold in the 3,200 at the District 2 Class 2A Track and Field Championships at North Pocono High School on May 15.

The Dallas 3,200 relay team of junior leadoff Jamie Stanish, freshman second leg Robin Razawich, Giacometti and junior anchor Whitney Adams dropped 16 seconds off its seed time to win in 9:55.0. That was just less than four seconds off the 18-

year-old meet record held by Meyers. The Mountaineers were the only sub-10:00 foursome and broke the school record by two seconds.

"We were confident. Our goal was to beat the school record," said Stanish. "We were all trying to get personal records."

Giacometti, who emerged as one of the top cross country runners in the area last fall, used spurts off the turns, especially during the fifth and sixth laps, to win the 3,200 in a personal-best time of 11:32.25.

"As I improved I got more confidence for track," said Giacometti. "I realized what I could do."

Other Mountaineers' medals were: Adams, sixth in the 800 (2:33.63); Stanish, fifth in the 1600 (5:43.55). The 1600 relay team finished fourth at 4:27.43.

As a team, Dallas finished seventh of 18 teams.

All event winners qualified for the PIAA Championships May 23-24, as did those who met the state qualifying standards.

He resides in Dallas with his parents, Trudy and Paul Clemson.

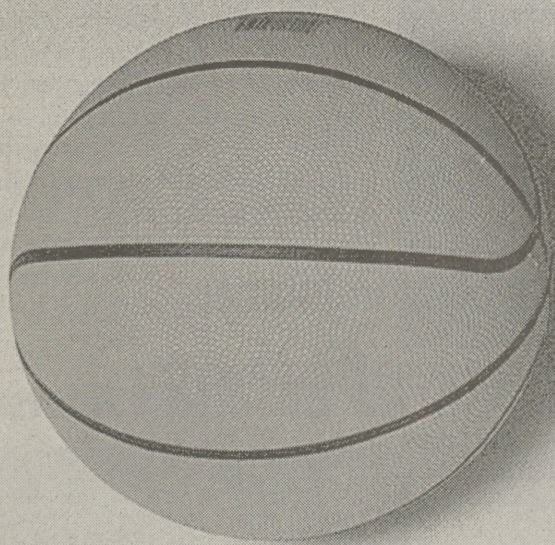
