overlooked because of the popularity of men's sports. "You can take talent and take potential in girls and maximize it," said Mary Ellen O'Brien, a Shavertown resident who has twin daughters in seventh grade. Both children are active

in sports. O'Brien said she plans

to urge them to take advantage

of what the Society has to offer. Besides the clinics and seminars, the Society's objectives include recognizing athletic achievement, providing opportunities for lifetime fitness and wellness activities for all ages, developing an appreciation of women's athletics, and encouraging camaraderie between diverse sport participants.

Pasqualichio said that in today's changing social climate, the benefits of being a part of an organization that promotes equality in athletics could ex-

tend well beyond the playing field. She cited one example of how learning a sport and becoming good at it could help an individual succeed in the corporate world.

"The top female executives are realizing that most of the deals are done on the golf course," Pasqualichio said. "So if you don't know how to golf, you're going to be at a disadvantage."




