Kingston Twp. chosen for 'Community Audit'

Kingston Township has been chosen as one of two Luzerne County municipalities, along with Wright Township, to participate in an "Community Audit" that is being funded jointly by the Pennsylvania Department of Community and Economic Development and the Pennsylvania Department of Conservation of Natural Resources. The services are being provided in response to development pressures that exist in the Back Mountain and Mountaintop areas.

The audit is being performed by EDAW Inc. and Greenway Inc. at the request of the Luzerne and Lackawanna Counties' Planning Commissions in preparation of a Bi-

County Open Space Master Plan. The audit involves a 3-step process that includes a Trend Evaluation and Document Evaluation followed by Mappings of Scenarios to be provided to the participating municipalities as well as the County.

Ordinances of the Township will be reviewed from environmental, open space, and greenway aspects along with current and prospective demographics. The evaluation will highlight the future needs of Kingston Township with respect to open space conservation and provide an invaluable tool for use in updating the Comprehensive Plan for the Township.
