She was preceded in death by her husband, Paul; and brother, George.

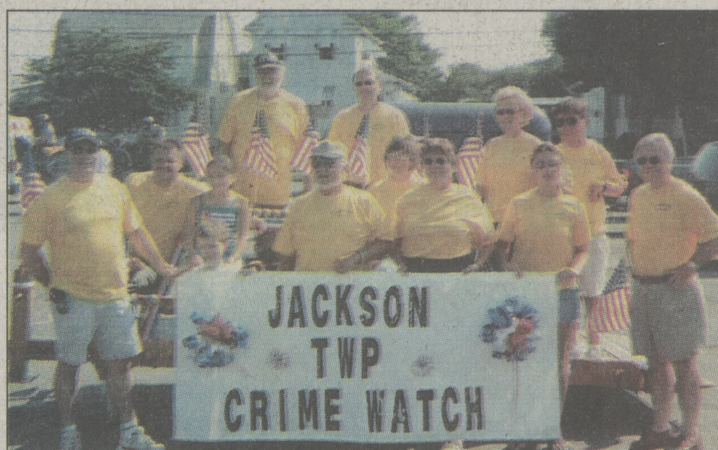
Surviving in addition to her mother are, sister, Deborah, Lynwood section of Hanover Township; brother, Richard, Dallas; and several nieces and nephews.

The burning of hazardous matter, including, but not limited to, any petroleum, hydrocarbon, plastic, or chemical matter, not normally considered as generated by the average household on a daily basis, is not permitted.
