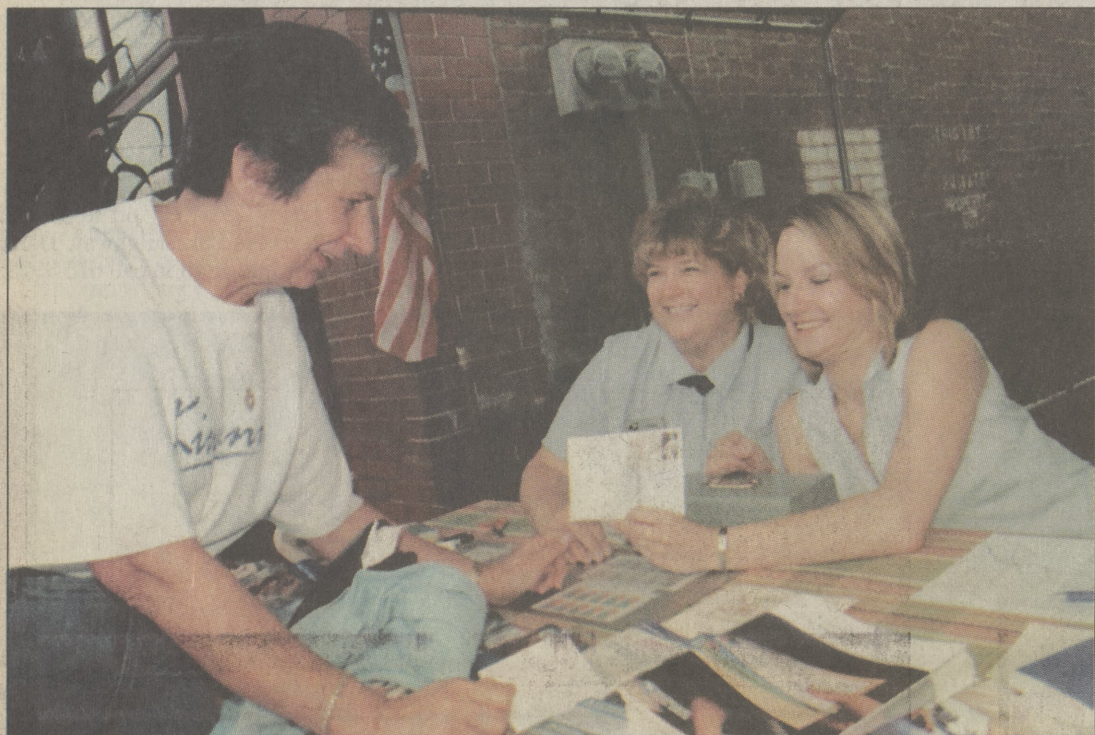


# What a great day!
