Volunteers and walkers are needed to help raise funds to

feed the hungry here and abroad. Last year the Wyoming Valley CROP Hunger Walk raised \$15,575. Of that amount 75 percent was sent through Church World Service and its partner agencies to feed people in the United States and around the world. The remaining 25 percent of funds returned to the valley and were distributed to thirteen local food banks or pantries. The 2003 goal is to have 400 walkers surpass the \$15,575 raised last year. Direct contributions are also accepted.
