Kingston Twp. sign ordinance

Kingston Township Ordinance 2003-7 requires that an Application for Permit for Political Signs is on file at the Kingston Township zoning office. Political signs shall not exceed four (4) square fees (576 square inches) in area and such signs shall not be attached to fences, trees, utility poles or the like. Also they should not be placed closer than five (5) feet to any Kingston Township owned property. They are not to be erected earlier than thirty (30) days prior to an election. The signs are to be removed no later than 10 days after the election, after which time, signs will be collected and disposed of by the township.

This year, signs should not be placed out earlier than October 5.
