Opening of 1,000 work project by Sue Hand

Artist Sue Hand, Dallas, will soon unveil her newest series, "The Light & The Land," a collection of over 1,000 drawings and paintings of the 11 counties of Northeastern Pennsylvania. "I love the light, the land, the hills and valleys and rivers — and it's my way of saying 'I love you' to Northeastern Pennsylvania," says Hand. Images of Dallas, Lehman, Trucksville, Centermoreland, and Harvey's Lake will all be included in the exhibit. This ongoing production began in the summer of 2000 and will continue through about 2010. Created in watercolor, oil, and acrylic, "The Light & The

Land" depicts images of the seasons, weather, panoramas, cityscapes, village scenes, riverscapes, festivals and celebrations of the Northeastern Pennsylvania region. The public is invited to attend the opening reception of "The Light & The Land," which will be hosted by Allied Services-John Heinz institute, 150 Mundy St., Wilkes-Barre, on Sunday Oct. 19 from 2-5 p.m. A gallery talk by the artist will be given at 2:30 p.m. in the patient dining room. The drawings and paintings will continue to be on exhibit at John Heinz Institute through the end of Hand's series.
