know that years from now we still will be coming up with new ideas that we haven't even thought of today."

The gymnasium building is the third structure built by this 50-year-old congregation of over 250 members. The main church building was the first of the education wing followed. "We have already raised \$50,000 in actual giving," said DeSilva, "and we took the bold step to finance the rest through bank, trusting that the Lord will provide through his faithful people."

"The new building is multipurpose on many levels," said Mark Stull, pastor of Christian Education. "Our hope is to present the word and grace of Jesus Christ to as many people as we can."

"It will also be a place where we can host events such as religious concerts, church dinners, Bible studies, and youth activities for our growing group of more than 100 youth and teens," said DeSilva.

"We can feed about 350 people out of our new state of the art kitchen and that's important to us because we have a lot of young families in our congregation," he said.

The church also plans to start a men's basketball league in November and to hold a blood drive with the Red Cross. Next summer, they plan to have a basketball league just for children to promote strong physical and spiritual skills for youth.

The three-day celebration and dedication will begin at 7 p.m. on Friday, Oct. 17 with a Christian praise and worship concert given by Cheri Keaggy, gospel singer and songwriter. Concert tickets are on sale for \$8. On Saturday there will be a Bible quiz for the children. On Sunday the formal dedication will take place followed by a family dinner in the evening.

"Our celebration is open to the public," said DeSilva. "We hope people will contact us and come to see God's grace at work in our community."
