'Doing Good'

I am intrigued by words spoken by Albert Schweitzer. He said, "The fundamental idea of good is thus: that it consists in preserving life, in favoring it, in wanting to bring it to its highest value; and evil consists in destroying life, doing it injury, hindering its development."

The Bible says of Jesus, "You know of Jesus of Nazareth, how God anointed Him with the Holy Spirit and with power, and how He went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with Him." (Acts 10:38)

There is a battle going on in our world today between good and evil. While there are some who have evil intentions and will do anything to bring those intentions to fruition, there are many more that let evil triumph because they do not do good.
