Adversity: Curse or Blessing

No one escapes adversity. There is no living adult immune to hardship nd the heartache, pressure and anuish that accompany it. Trial comes in many forms: sickness, rejection, poverty, enemies, being unforgiving. Most often we view these as interruptions or setbacks in in life.

The divine view is different. For God, adversity is not a roadblock to believers. Instead, adversity is the fuel that advances growth.

When we are tested by trials, it is not uncommon to ask "why?" Often many questions follow: "Is this my own doing? Is it a test from Satan? Is this the work of the lord?"

Whatever the source of adversity, it must be understood in light of the permissive will of God. Everything that comes your way is not necessarily the Lord's will. But God does permit everything that occurs. God knows how even adversity can be a patch in the quilt work of your life (Romans 8:28). God knows how even adversity will fit into His wonderful purpose for your life.

In the 55th chapter of Isaiah at vs. 8 and 9, it is made clear, "God's thoughts ways) are higher than ours." Therefore, we cannot expect to understand all that God is doing. God is able to take the most painful experiences and use them to prepare us for what lies ahead. Knowing how to respond to adversity is more important than knowing the source of our adversity.
