"We had to have a solid third quarter, and that didn't really go as planned," Wentko said.

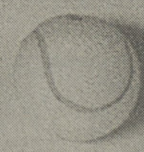
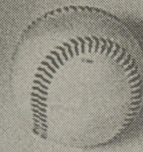
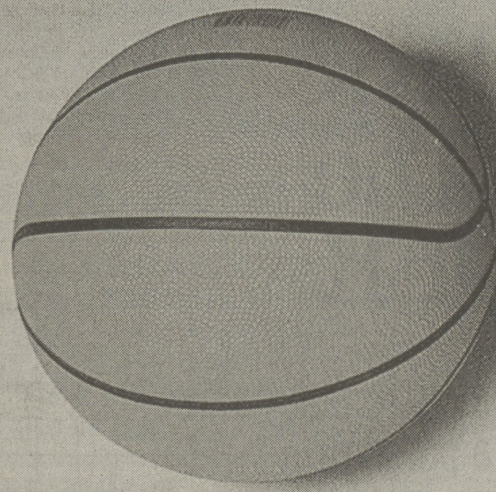
Wentko, who scored a modest team high of 14 points, sparked the offense in the fourth quarter, the best eight minutes of basketball by both teams.
