**Boating course planned**

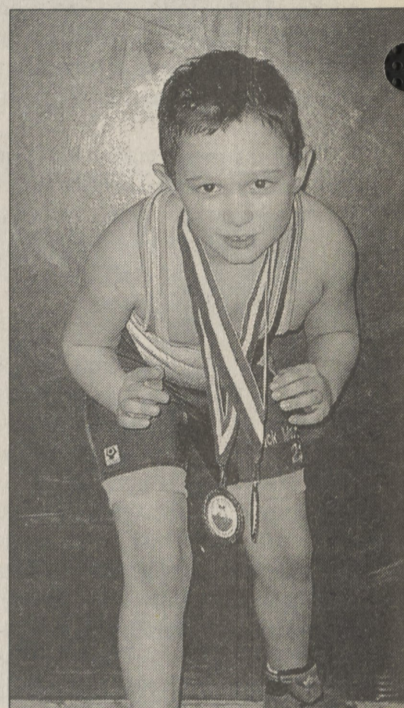
The state Fish and Boat Commission and its cooperators are offering several basic boating courses in the region. Most of these eight-hour courses are free, and all are open to the public.

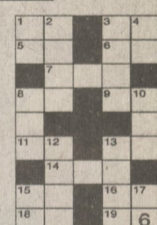

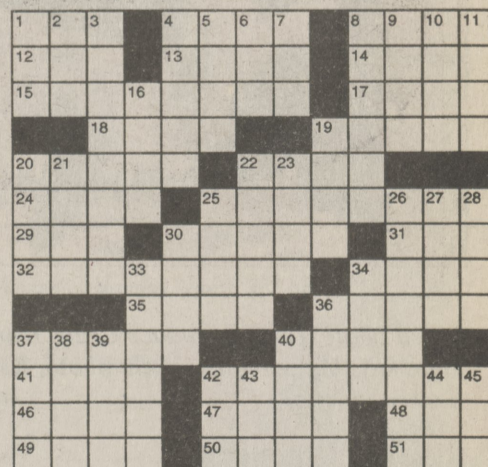
