In accordance with Ordinance #5 of 2001, all Jackson

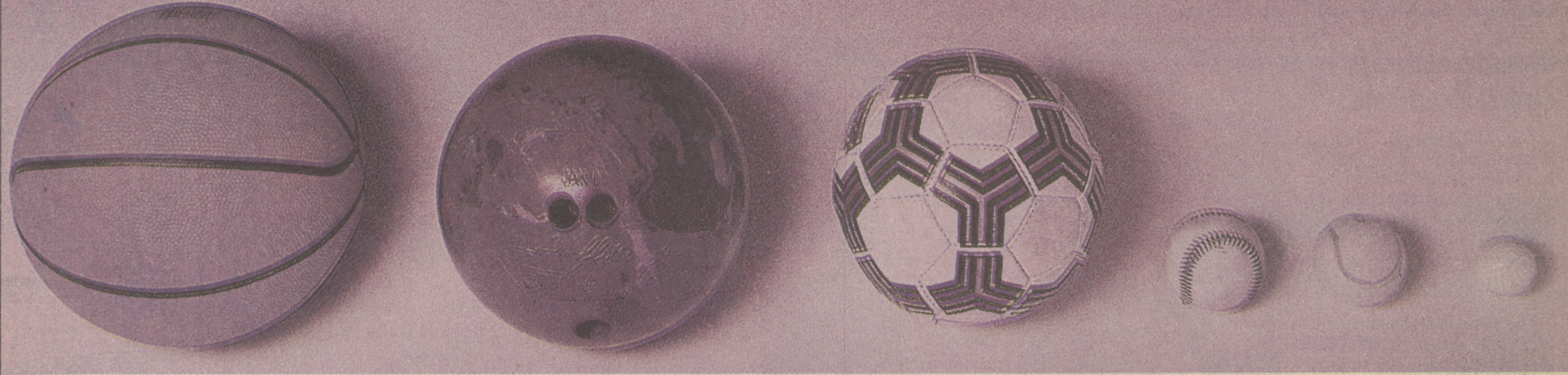
